

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we wish to draw to the attention of Lyneham & Bradenstoke Parish Council for the year ended 31 March 2015

Appointment of internal auditor

The council did not formally appoint the internal auditor at a council meeting.

The internal auditor for Lyneham & Bradenstoke Parish Council is the chair of a neighbouring council to which the clerk to Lyneham and Bradenstoke Parish Council is also clerk.

We understand from the council that all councillors were aware of the connection. However there was no formal consideration by the council at a meeting as to whether the independence of the internal auditor could be affected by this connection.

The council should consider annually, at a council meeting, the competence and independence of the internal auditor and resolve to appoint them. This process should be recorded in the minutes.

Staff costs

Staff costs of £24,065 are included in Box 4 on the Annual Return. This figure incorrectly includes legal fees of £5,316 relating to staff matters. Staff costs in Box 4 should only include expenditure or payments made to and on behalf of all employees, including salaries and wages, PAYE and NI (employees and employers), pension contributions and employment expenses. Legal costs should be included in Box 6.

Box 4 should read £18,749 and Box 6 should read £41,081.
